Emphasis was given to experiential learning; thus, we have made the student to involve in practicals to make him/her understand the concept of theory / what he/she has learnt in the class room and to gain hands on experience in operating instruments and to

improve their practical skills. Therefore, it is not an exaggeration to say when most of the colleges are doing away with practicals, we have invested on it to make our students different from others, and to make them a face in the crowd.

Special oratory activities have been designed for IV B.Pharm students during the entire semester to master good communication skills. Apart from this, seminars have also been organized for exposing the students to higher levels of learning.

Perfect discipline is maintained in the campus to provide safety, security, and ambience for learning. A balance between curricular and extra-curricular activities is very well maintained in the college to prevent any student entering into a state of boredom or to become a bookworm.

Staff:

We have 21 full time teaching faculty members, 02 part-time faculties, 06 visiting faculties, 06 office staff members, and 18 non-teaching staff members in our college. We have 6 faculty members with Ph.D degree, and 3 faculty members with more than 20 years of experience.
